

<u>Invitation to the press conference at the start of the Global Food Summit 2019</u> Foodtropolis - Will Cities Shape our Perception of Food and Nature?

Berlin, 27 February 2019: The Global Food Summit 2019 invites to a press conference on 20 March 2019 in the Press Club in Munich.

The future of agriculture will increasingly take place in the heart of our metropolises: Vertical farming, insect proteins and aquaponics are almost part of everyday life. Clean meat or algae production on house facades are about to make a breakthrough.
